Fall presentation features information on guardianships and special needs trusts

We are pleased to present attorney Denise Redinger speaking about guardianships, alternatives to guardianship, and special needs trusts, from 6:30- 8:30 pm Thursday, November 6th at the Sallal Grange, 12912 432nd Ave SE, North Bend.

Redinger will provide an overview on the need for, and the pros and cons of, guardianships and alternatives to guardianships. She will also discuss the process for obtaining guardianship through an attorney, obtaining one without an attorney, and the periodic reporting for people who already have a guardianship in place. She will also present information on the necessity of special needs trusts and explain their interaction with the other estate planning documents.

There will be an ice cream social from 6:30-7 pm, with the presentation for the parents, along with bingo for the younger audience, from 7-8:30 pm.
