#### Friends of LEO,

We are very pleased to report that the LEO Organization had a strong year of performance in 2023.

**Molly Simpson** has completed her first year in her role of Program Director and we were able to add a part time associate, **Jin Lee**, in the first quarter of 2023. As Operations Manager, Jin is able to focus on the property and office management areas of LEO allowing Molly to work on existing programs and new initiatives.

These staffing decisions are key to our effort to assure the long -term success of the LEO Organization. It is a joy to experience the energy and creativity these two bring to our LEO mission.

Many of the initiatives that we announced in 2022 continue to flourish. **Our five homes** are near the 27 resident capacity and they continue to benefit from the exceptional management of their care providers. We are now ready to look for additional housing opportunities for our community. In addition to the Issaquah Transit Oriented Development TOD project that is planned we hope to announce additional projects as 2024 progresses.

LEO experienced a major benefit in '23 when the Washington State legislators passed a bill sponsored by **Mark Mullet, Senator** and **Bill Ramos, Representative** granting property tax exemption for our homes and others providing housing services to the IDD community. This **tax exemption** is critical to the financial stability of the LEO Organization as it greatly reduces our annual operating costs.

Please give a big "Thank You" to each of these parties.

Adaptive Recreation Programs were re-booted in May of '23 as LEO members had petitioned the City of Issaquah to reinstate these critical services in the fall of '22. The Community Center hired Callie Weber. As a result, a wide range of activities were quickly offered, enabling over 102 individuals to participate in these programs by year end 2023. A remarkable recovery! Thank you, Callie! You have made a huge difference in many lives.

Our second **LEO Annual Picnic** was held August '23 and was a huge success as two hundred and two people joined us for a picnic dinner and were entertained by the **LEO Performers** in Dance, Voice, and Drama. This event brought many families together and, by demand, will be scheduled to return in August of 2024.

#### Challenge Car Races to return!

In 2022, **Leo Finnegan** retired from his **45- year commitment** to bring joy to every child that wanted to race. Early on, when his son Tim wanted to ride in a soap box derby, Leo was compelled to find a way for Tim to participate. The result was a relationship with Rotary Clubs all over Washington State sponsoring Challenge Car Races for kids with developmental disabilities and with co-drivers assisting.

Last year Snoqualmie, Lynnwood, North Bainbridge Island, and Spokane Rotaries decided to carry on the tradition. **Well done Leo!** 

I thank our Board of Directors for all of the volunteer hours they contribute to assure to the **Sustainability** of the LEO Organization. I cannot Imagine an environment without your support.



#### Events/Programs

We were overjoyed to bring back the Challenge Race Series in partnership with the Rotary of Snoqualmie Valley. There were over 25 participants that raced the gravity cars in May of 2023. LEO also started a new program "Friday Night Hang outs" that allowed local community members with IDD to participate in fun Friday night activities like Karaoke, BINGO and board games.

In 2022 LEO's Board Members and other community members advocated to the City of Issaquah for a dedicated staff person to run an Adaptative Recreation Program. 


